WHEREAS, §11-67-1 et Seq., of the *Code of Alabama*, 1975, as amended, permits the City Council of the City of Prattville to declare an abundance of overgrown grass and weeds to be a public nuisance; and

WHEREAS, the Prattville Police Department Code Enforcement Officer has inspected the property at the following addresses and determined the existence of an abundance of overgrown grass and weeds:

WHEREAS, a stream mitigation credit is a unit of trade used to offset ecological losses allowing a buyer to satisfy their environmental mitigation permit needed prior to impacting aquatic resources; and

WHEREAS, the City of Prattville Wastewater Division of the Public Works Department has a need to purchase two thousand two hundred twenty-one and forty-one hundredths (2,224.41) stream mitigation credits for the CWSRF Thomas Avenue Drainage and Sanitary Sewer Improvements Project; and

WHEREAS, said stream mitigation credits are available for sale and transfer from Arlington Plantation Mitigation Bank through Lone Oak Capital Management LLC under the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) permit number SAM-2014-00722-MBM at a net cost not to exceed \$177,172.80.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Prattville, that the Mayor is authorized to enter into an Agreement with Lone Oak Capital Management LLC for said stream mitigation credits.

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“State Severe Weather Preparedness Sales Tax Holiday” Legislation.]

{Sponsored By: Council President Starnes}

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of Prattville, Alabama, as follows:

Section 1. In conformity with the provisions Act 2012-256 enacted by the Alabama Legislature during the 2012 Regular Session, providing for a State Severe Weather Preparedness Sales Tax Holiday, the City of Prattville, Alabama, exempts “covered items” from municipal sales and use tax during the same period, beginning at 12:01 a.m. on Friday, February 25, 2022, and ending at twelve midnight on the following Sunday, February 27, 2022.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be subject to all terms, conditions, definitions, time periods and rules as provided by Act 2012-256, except that the time period shall only be as specified in Section 1 above and not for all years thereafter.

Section 3. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to certify a copy of this ordinance under the seal of the City of Prattville, Alabama, and to forward said certified copy to the Alabama Department of Revenue to be recorded and posted on the Department website.

Section 4. This ordinance shall become effective upon its passage and publication as required by law.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Prattville, Alabama, that Chapter 6

– Alcoholic Beverages”, is amended as follows:

Sec. 6-11. – Outdoor Alcohol Service

Any on-premises license may serve alcoholic beverages as authorized by their license on patios and other outdoor areas adjacent to or connected with their main licensed premises. Said serving area shall be fenced or otherwise contained by a permanent or semi-permanent barrier, shall direct access from the interior of the licensed premises and shall not be located in any required parking or landscaping area. Each side of the barrier shall have conspicuous signage that reads “No Alcohol Beyond This Point.” Further restrictions may be placed on outdoor service areas by the City Council.

THIS ordinance shall become effective upon its passage and execution as provided by law. Each of the provisions of this ordinance are severable; and if any provision shall be declared to be invalid, the remaining provisions shall not be affected but shall remain in full force. All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, in any manner conflicting herewith are hereby repealed.
